Check in Assessments - years 4 & 6

NAPLAN - years 3 & 5

At our school our teachers are always assessing our students so that we can provide targeted teaching at point of need. This Wednesday, Thursday and Friday students in years 4 and 6 will take part in check in assessments. The Check-in assessments are used to supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Assessment Program - Literacy and How to apply Numeracy (NAPLAN). This program, which has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers, assesses the literacy and numeracy learning of students in all Australian schools.

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on combined results Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Wednesday 21 July 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2022, you need to apply between Tuesday 20 April 2021 and Friday 7 May 2021. You will need to

access the online application at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public -schools/selective-high-schools-andopportunity-classes/year-5 You must not use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after Tuesday 20 April 2021. If you would like further information about this please contact our school office.




